## Summer School Program

Holly Springs High School will offer a site-based summer school program for students who need to recover credit. HSHS will use the NovaNet lab to provide an individualized computer-based curriculum to students. Summer School is **FREE** to all WCPSS students. Holly Springs High School will offer the following courses during Summer School for 2008:

English I  
English II  
English III  
World History  
Civics and Economics  
United States History  
Earth Science  
Physical Science  
Biology  
IntroMath (Pre-Algebra)  
Algebra I  
Tech Math I  
Tech Math II  
Geometry

**Students will be allowed to pick up and drop off their Summer School Application from June 2 thru June 10, 2008. All completed applications MUST be received no later than 3:00 p.m. on June 10. (Incomplete applications will NOT be accepted. All paperwork MUST be returned by the deadline.) Based on the priority order listed below, students will be selected to attend Summer School for 2008. We will try to accommodate AM vs. PM session preference as much as possible. Students selected will be contacted, and both the student and the parent will come in to OFFICIALLY register for Summer School from June 24 thru June 26. Slots will be available for parents/students to choose. This process will take 15-20 minutes.**

The summer school program will run **from July 2 through August 7, 2008** and will be supervised by WCPSS certified teachers. Sessions will have a maximum of 15 students, with a total of 30 students being served in both sessions. Any open seats in the NovaNet class will be offered to non-base WCPSS students after the needs of the HSHS population have been met.

**Population Served:** (HSHS 2007-08 base students)

**Students are admitted in the following priority order:**

- 1) HSHS juniors needing a recovery course for promotion and to graduate on time
- 2) HSHS sophomores needing a recovery course for promotion
- 3) HSHS freshmen needing a recovery course for promotion

**Curriculum:** HSHS will use the NovaNET curriculum placement assessments and course content, with recommended supplemental materials. EOC tests will be given to all students enrolled in an EOC classes according to guidelines set by the state of North Carolina and the WCPSS Testing Office.

**Classes will be offered in the four core areas:** English, Math, and Science & Social Studies

**Grade Reports** : Notification of summer school grades is mailed to students at the end of the Summer School Session. This takes the place of an official report card. Parents need to monitor progress on a daily basis. Grades will be sent to the NC WISE Data Manager of the base school for entry into the student's transcript.

Exams are administered to all students at the end of the session. In all courses with an End-of-Course test, the EOC test shall count as 25% of the student's final grade. In courses without an End-of-Course test, the final exam shall count up to 20% of the grade. All EOC and final exams will be administered on the final day of the summer school program (EOC courses are English I, Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, Physical Science, Chemistry, Physics, Civics & Economics, U.S. History). By NC law, students who were first time 9<sup>th</sup> graders in '06-'07 must pass the EOC exam in English I, Algebra I, Civics & Economics, Biology, and US History in order to pass the course. The grade earned in Summer School will count toward the GPA and will appear on the transcript. All previous grades remain on the transcript and are calculated in the GPA.
